Phonics

Reception have been reading words with two or more digraphs such as, sharp, march, torch and shower. **Year One** have continued to 'grow the code', exploring alternative spelling patterns such as le and al making the I sound (eg apple/ metal), s making the c sound (eg ice) and ve making the v sound (eg give). They have also learnt the tricky words school, call and different.

Maths

Reception have been comparing numbers to 10 and 20 and identifying the largest and smallest set. They have then matched the set to the correct numeral. They have also been ordering numbers to 10/20 using a pegged number line, identifying the larger and smaller of two numbers using the number line as a guide. Following on from this they used a number line to help them find one more and one less than a number and write the addition and subtraction sentences to match.

Year One's focus has been on units of time such as weeks, days, hours and minutes. They have developed an understanding of how long a minute, hour, day and week are. They have been reading and writing times to the hour and half hour on an analogue and digital clock.

Drawing Club- We have focussed on the story *The Dinosaur Department Store*! The children have explored the characters (the department store manager), setting (the city) and used their imaginations to change the story such as, the dinosaurs are all over the city and how can we get them all back to safety? We have explored new vocabulary relating to the story such as, whipping, magnificent, squawk, imprisoned, armoured, smirked, furious and release. We added actions to help us remember them!

Thank you for practising the class assembly lines at home; please continue to do so as they are still a little unsure at times. Remember to practise using a loud voice too! Thank you.


